The Treasurer's report was given by Boyd Ready and accepted after a motion made by Kerry Fox and and seconded from Chuck Garber to approve. Bills were presented by Secretary Alan Tast for \$153.27 for printing and mailing of the October newsletter, and Boyd presented a bill for \$60 for the Council's annual post office box rent; a motion was made and seconded to pay the bills. OLD BUSINESS

2013 CAR COUNCIL FALL FOLIAGE TOUR OCTOBER 6TH

Fourteen cars and 35 people participated in the Council's Fall Foliage Tour at Waubonsie State Park. Poor weather in the form of rain and cold may have hindered turnout, but according to participants there was way too much food but all had a good time. Roy Murabito reported that it appeared that there was enough food for 60 people. The Slo Rollers had the shelter set up by 10 am. Boyd Ready thanked the Slo Rollers for their efforts and help on behalf of the Council. After discussion centering around the need to increase participation, it was motioned by Walt Grentski

BLUE-DOT TAILLIGHT USE TICKETED IN OMAHA

Reports of a person being ticketed for use of blue dot taillights in Omaha were discussed. While there was little information on the incident, discussion centered on previous actions that had been undertaken to allow their use. As nobody at the meeting had any statutes available to review, it is asked that information related to their use be brought to the November meeting in Lincoln to review what is allowable.

RALSTON THRUSDAY CRUISE NIGHT CHANGE FOR 2014 IN STORE

With the loss of sponsorship of the Thursday night "Justin Thyme" cruise night on 84th and Park Avenue, a new sponsor and location has been arranged for 2014. The cruise night will move to the east lot of Bushwacker's at 7400 Main Street in Ralston. The change in venue will allow for a beer garden and grill/food service.

PAST EVENTS LAMBRECHT CHEVROLET DEALERSHIP AUCTION

Tthe Lambrecht auction in Pierce on September 28-29 drew over 15,000 people to the little northeast Nebraska town, according to media reports, with sales reported to have totaled over \$2.8 million. Media coverage included a televised broadcast of the auction on the Discovery Channel: two members of the Slo Rollers were featured as they assisted bidders and spectators during the weekend by crawling under cars to give an appraisal of their condition.

OTHER PAST EVENTS

Roy Murabito reported that 350+ cars were registered for the "Cruisin' Main" show in Plattsmouth-the event was moved back a week because of rain on the original show date. Rockport's "Old Fashioned Saturday Night" drew 35-40 cars according to members of the Slo Rollers, while the "Relay for Life" show they assist with raised \$17,000. The High Impact Performance MoPar Club reported that their "Hot Cars for Heroes" show in July raised \$7500 for the Wounded Warriors Project. The Nebraska Corvette Association's annual All Corvette Show in southeast Lincoln drew 256 'Vettes, including 18 first-generation models with three '53 models: the event raised \$13,000 that was split between the Food Bank of Lincoln and the Child Advocacy Center. Kerry Fox attended the new Corvette introduction at Harcel Road Chevrolet in Imperial, Nebraska, which drew 178 Corvettes with 10 new 2014 'Vettes on display. Tangier Shrine's "End of Summer" show was a sellout. Vendor count at the Fremont Antique Auto Club's annual swap meet at the end of September appeared to be down again, while the Wahoo Swap Meet a few weeks later had a larger turnout with vendors filling much of the Saunders County Fairgrounds.


