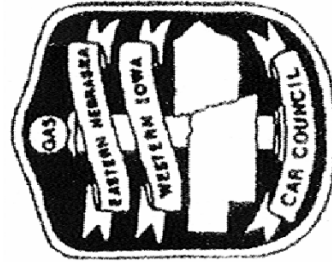
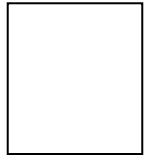

MEETING MINUTES - August 15, 2012

INTRODUCTIONS

President Chuck Roberts called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM in Omaha, NE.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as printed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer's report was given by Gerry Tice. Gene Gau made a motion to accept the report with Dan Kavalek seconding. Motion passed. Bills were presented by Secretary Alan Tast in the amount of \$83.31 for printing and mailing of the August minutes; a motion by Monte Frost and seconded by Roy Murabito for payment was approved.

OLD BUSINESS

SWAP MEET

No business to report. The Swap Meet Committee will begin planning for the 2013 Swap Meet in September.

CLUB/REPRESENTATIVE LIST UPDATES

Secretary Alan Tast passed around a list of clubs and representatives, asking for updates to listings. Alan asked clubs to add information related to national/international clubs that can be listed in the 2013 Calendar of Events. Treasurer Gerry Tice provided Alan with an updated list of clubs that have paid their 2012.

NEW BUSINESS

E-15 Discussion

Alan Tast reported on recent developments in the introduction of E-15 gasohol, which has 15% ethanol content. According to reports from other enthusiast watchdog groups, the Environmental Protection Agency is proceeding with plans to allow retailers to offer E-15 at the same pumps as E-10 and fuel without ethanol. Complaints from small engine owners including motorcyclists, ATV owners and those using small gas-powered equipment, were being raised that the EPA was mandating that a minimum of four gallons of fuel must be purchased at a time in order to dilute any residual E-15 that may be in the hoses at multi-blend pumps.

PAST EVENTS

Dodge Street Charity Cruise

The charity car cruise from Burke High to downtown Omaha drew an estimated 45-50 cars.

Joslyn Castle Concours

Jim Snyder gave a summary on the July 29th weekend fundraiser for the Joslyn Castle Foundation. A total of 98 registrations were recorded, including 17 motorcycles, with attendees coming from as far as Des Moines and Kansas City. A period-customized 1950 Hudson and a 1946 Indian motorcycle were deemed by spectators to be "Best of Show" recipients, while a 1938 Packard received the highest marks in the judged portion of the concours. Participants on Saturday were treated to a visitation of the muscle car collection of Jim Murray west of Yutan, Nebraska, along with a rare opportunity to go through the Jim Duffek collection in Omaha. Both days also featured dinner for participants following the day's activities.

Miscellaneous Event News

Randolph, Iowa's car show was held on the Saturday of that weekend and not on Sunday as printed in the Council's Calendar of Events: people were reminded to contact event organizers ahead of time to verify dates/times, and to provide updated information for future calendars...Larry Robb noted that a show held at the Hy-Vee at 96th & Q Streets was well-attended with a full parking lot for the show area...Monte Frost noted that a show held at 96th and I Street featured mostly newer Camaros.
