MEETING MINUTES - September 16, 2015

INTRODUCTIONS

Meeting started at 7:30 PM

Roy Murabito called the meeting to order in the absence of the President. He asked that everyone sign in on the sign in sheet. He also asked that everyone also check the membership roster to verify their contact information. Roy asked that everyone present introduce themselves to the group.

GUESTS ADDRESSING THE COUNCIL

No guests in attendance this evening.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Kerry Fox made a motion to approve the minutes of the August meeting. Frank Wimmer seconded the motion. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

In Treasurer Boyd Ready's absence, Jim Snyder read the Treasurer's report. Motion to approve by Larry Robb and Chuck Garber seconded. Motion carried.

One bill presented by Secretary Cindy Wimmer in the amount of \$49.95 for the production of the August newsletter. Motion to approve by Kerry Fox.
Seconded by Jim McNeil. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Kerry Fox talked about Farm Bureau Insurance's decision to give us a new agent. Kerry talked to the new agent and he said that he would check into our issues with the audit by Farm Bureau. Paul Johnson is the new representative for the Car Council with Farm Bureau Insurance. Paul worked with Farm Bureau to straighten out our dilemma with our yearly premiums. They did a re-audit and dropped our insurance costs back to the pre-audit costs. They based our membership at 500. (This number is based on the information that was given to us by the car clubs that carry their own insurance and those car clubs that don't carry insurance. Thank you to those clubs for sending us your insurance information in to the insurance committee). We now have a check in the amount of \$3,451.00 as a refund of what they charged us previously based on a larger number of members. Farm Bureau apologized for this inconvenience the past 4+ months. Farm Bureau however, still does not want to insure us in 2016. However, they will submit a request to ask Allied Insurance Company to give us a quote of what they would charge us if they insured us next year. This would also cover us in Omaha at our meetings every other month. They said it would be in our best interest to have a safety plan in place for the swap meet. They gave Kerry an example of what they wish we had in place. They also wanted the individual car clubs that carry insurance to name the ENWICC on their insurance policies in the future. They thought that the new quote would come in where it had before at approximately \$1,100 or \$1,200 dollars per year. Kerry Fox was very pleased that the work his committee had done this past year finally saw some positive results. There were questions from the members present and Kerry answered those to the best of his knowledge. The members present gave a round of applause to the Insurance Committee for all of their work this past year. Without the members on this committee doing all of the work that they did and putting in all of the time that they did holding meetings, this conclusion could have had a negative result instead of the positive results that it has had. Thank you to all of the members on the Insurance Committee !!
